

WHAT IS IT?

DIY photo booth!



MATERIALS NEEDED

Backdrop:

- Cardboard/tablecloth/sheet
- Command strips and hooks/pins/tape/mechanism for hanging fabric
- Scissors
- String lights (optional)

Props (optional):

- Small wooden dowels or large craft sticks
- Cardstock
- Glue (optional)
- Markers/crayons/paints
- Dress up items fun hats, silly sunglasses, fancy scarves, etc.

HOW DO YOU DO IT?

Option 1: Backdrop

- 1. Hang a tablecloth, sheet, or large swath of fabric as a backdrop.
- 2. If using, hang string lights.
- 3. Make fun props and place near the backdrop (optional)
- 4. Invite people to use their phones to take photos. Encourage them to tag the library in any photos they post online.

HOW DO YOU DO IT?(continued)

Option 1: Cardboard Cutout

- 1. Deconstruct a large cardboard box so it's laying as flat as possible.
- Create a scene, making sure there's at least one good place to cut a hole for someone to peek through.
- Using a utility knife, cut peep holes in the appropriate places.
 Make sure they're large enough to see someone's whole face.
- 4. Prop your scene up against a couple of chairs so it can stand alone. Keep in mind how much space is behind it so people can easily pose.

Option 3: Picture Frame



- 1. Deconstruct a large cardboard box so it's laying as flat as possible.
- 2. Draw frame shapes onto the box. Use a utility knife to cut them out. Make sure they're large enough so the inside space can show at least one person's portrait.
- 3. Decorate the frame!
- 4. Place the frame in a public location. Invite people to use their phones to take photos.
